Discovering the Ocean

At the Oceanographic Museum of Monaco

All the students from the school went to the Oceanographic Museum of Monaco. On board a coach, the children were able to enjoy the view of a magnificent Mediterranean Sea sparkling in the sun. Arriving at the foot of this magnificent building, the museum opened its doors to us. In its depths, the children discovered an array of aquariums of the Mediterranean and tropical seas, as well as the Sea Turtle Odyssey zone.

The Food Chains

A workshop was presented to them in small groups, concerning marine food chains. Using images of living marine organisms, they were able to establish together the complex food chains between species within an ecosystem through which energy and matter circulate.

After a picnic in the sun on the roof terrace, the children travelled in immersion from the North Pole to the South Pole. In the Immersion room, the wild and immense beauty of these icy lands came to life in a unique immersive and interactive device. On 650 m2 of projection surface, 6 emblematic scenes of polar landscapes were broadcast. This virtual enchantment presented the fragile and tumultuous life of polar animals and ended with the incredible spectacle of the Northern Lights.
